## From The Monastery

Dear Scho Girls,

I begin this message to you with a sad heart because of having to tell you that our dear Sr. Cabrini, your Moderator, will not have a message for you in this issue because she was in a serious accident Sunday, October the 18th, on her way home from a reunion with relatives in Paris, Arkansas. She and Sister Audrey were in a head on collision in Barling, AR, both were seriously hurt. Sr. Audrey suffered a compound fracture in her right ankle and C2 in her neck; Sr. Cabrini had a few more injuries. Both of her clavicles were badly bruised, 3 fractured vertebrae: C7 (neck), 1 thoracic (mid-back) and 1 lumbar (lower back). She will be put in neck and body brace to protect these areas. There will no surgery, thank God! She did have some fractured ribs which punctured her lungs that are being watched closely. She was taken to Washington General in Fayetteville because of the fractured vertebrae in her back. Sister Audrey has remained at Mercy where she is doing as well as can be expected. Hopefully by the time you receive this edition they will be here at home recuperating. We are thankful that the family in the other car we not hurt just a few bruises which can be painful.

Our future planning is moving along these days, but not as fast I had hoped it would be at this time. I was just thinking about the whole process as learning to walk first with baby steps (which seems that is where we are) and not ready to take steps on our own. The whole process has been a journey of faith and hope. Perhaps when you come for the Reunion September 2016 there will signs that we have taken (grown up) steps!! Please keep praying for us.

I suppose we have taken a grown up step by hiring American Citizen Bureau, a consulting company out of Chicago to help us in the viability study of having a Capital Campaign. ACB is the company that has helped a number of monasteries in this venture of raising money for their reconstruction. We are hopeful that their work with us will be fruitful.

Our two junior professed sisters are doing ministries in parishes to be a presence among the people. Sister Judith Marie Timmerman is teaching Spanish at Christ the King parish in Fort Smith. She teaches children from pre-school age to the sixth grade. She says she enjoys her work. Sister Michaela Marie Boucoud is living at the House of Prayer where she has been studying for her Nurse Practitioner's license renewal. She helps the sisters with duties there at the House of Prayer.

We are thinking about replacing the St. Scholastica statue back on the academy (Trinity) building because she has lain in her coffin long enough. I have discussed it with Fr. John Antony and Karen Hollenbeck, the Principal of Trinity about putting her back and they agreed to the project. We are the process of getting an estimate of the cost. Perhaps when we find the cost the Alumnae will help with the cost. Thank you for thinking on this matter.

I would like to introduce you to a woman who has become interested in our art work or painting of our artists. She is Monica Moore and she developed a calendar of Sr. Roberta and Sr. Stanislaus' art work to sell. Her intention is to make our artists known. The funds from selling the calendars will go to St. Scholastica. She has included explanation of how to get them in this newsletter.

We grateful for your love, support, and care for us, your sisters, in faith and hope. May God's blessing be with each of you as we journey toward the end of 2015. As we celebrate all the feasts that come our way in these next few months bring you peace and gratitude to the God who loves us with an everlasting love.



## Minutes of the St. Scholastica Alumnae Association, September 28, 2013

The business meeting of the St. Scholastica Alumnae Association was held on Saturday afternoon of the 2013 Reunion in the Chapter Room of St. Scholastica Monastery. The Chapter Room is formerly the old gymnasium/auditorium in the monastery building.

Dorothy Worner Sullivan, president, called the meeting to order. Sr. Maria DeAngeli, Prioress, led the opening prayer and welcomed everyone. Jean Ann Bercher Roddy, vice-president, led the roll call by years. Annette Vogelpohl Knittig gave the financial report.

Sister Maria gave a report of the state of the Monastery and the challenges the community is facing, followed by a vocation report by Sr. Barbara Bock. Sister Rosalie Ruesewald then gave a short talk on The Benedictine Partners in Education, involving St. Scholastica's sponsorship of Catholic education of children in Guatemala. Sr. Rachel Dietz spoke on the Spiritual Directors Program which she is heading up.

Dorothy then announced the proposed projects for the Alumnae, refurbishing the signs on the monastery property, one at Free Ferry and Albert Pike, the other at Albert Pike and Rogers Ave. It was unanimously voted in favor of having the work done at a cost of \$5,701.32 plus tax.

The outgoing officers were recognized for their 3 terms of 3 years each, totaling 9 years of service: Dorothy Worner Sullivan '60 President; Jean Ann Bercher Roddy '60 Vice-President; Virginia Rinke Ricketts '66 Secretary;

Annette Vogelpohl Knitting '62 Treasurer; Doris Geels Koch '60 Historian.

The new slate of officers were introduced and elected by a unanimous show of hands. They are Barbara Hug Anhalt '59 President; Jane Berry Sanders '61 Vice-president; Mary Kennedy Burns '64 Secretary; Nancy Fritz Ciulla '58 Treasurer, and Emily Geels Soller '64 Historian.

Dorothy then thanked all those who worked on the reunion, especially Julie Robben Lineberry '66 for her work on the Alumnator. She announced the dates of the upcoming Annual Bake Sale to be held December 14-15, 2013 at the Center. Also a reminder of the Banquet at 6:00 PM this evening at IC Parish Center and Mass at 10:00 AM Sunday morning at the Monastery Chapel followed by Brunch in the dining room. Remember that the gift shop will be open after Mass. There was an appeal for volunteers to put up chairs and tables on Monday at 1:00 PM at the Center.

A special thank you was given to Sr. Maria and the community for opening up their home to us during the reunion as the center had been booked for a retreat that same date! As there was no further business, the meeting was closed with the school song accompanied by Sr. Rosalie and Sr. Barbara. Tours of the refurbished swimming pool area followed the business meeting.


